**January 5th to February 22nd, 2024**

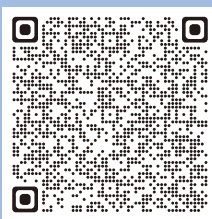

- Be a female university/college student or graduate
- Have at least half year of Japanese language study experience

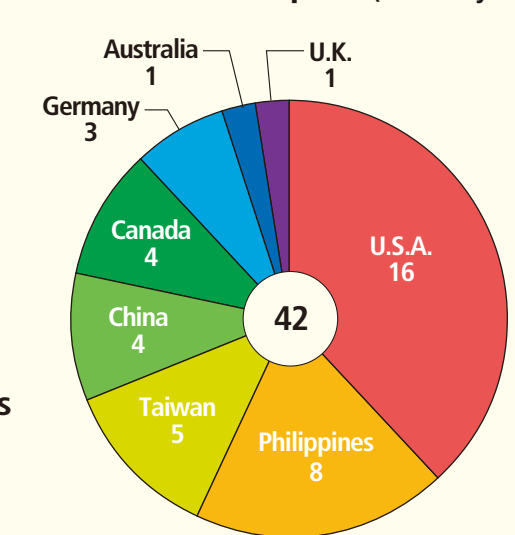
#### Term B
