

# Sep.25-Dec.18, 2024 In Kyoto, Japan.

### Application Period: until April 26th, 2024

#### **JSP Components**

- Japanese Language Courses

#### **Accommodations**

1. Homestay: [60,000 yen/month]

Live with the family of a DWCLA or Doshisha University student or graduate. The fee includes two meals per day.

- 2. Mukaijima Gakusei Center: [45,866 yen×1 month, 32,000 yen×2 months] Single rooms are available in the Kyoto municipal housing for international students. No meals are included in the fee. The dormitory is located 30 minutes by train from the Imadegawa campus and a 15-minute walk from Kintetsu Mukaijima Station.
- \*Decisions on accommodation will be made based on availability and each participant's request. If the above accommodations are not available, participants may be assigned to other dormitories.

#### Financial aid

Grants of 200,000 yen are available for participants from affiliated colleges / universities. Recipients will receive 20,000 yen cash on the first orientation day, and the remaining 180,000 yen will automatically be allocated as follows:

- Homestay: 60,000 yen×3 months
- Mukaijima Gakusei Center: 109,866 yen for accommodations & 70,134 yen for meals (for 3 months)

Doshisha Women's College's JSP program was an experience better than I could have hoped for. The university is located away from the city center, so I had a quiet space to live, but it is not so far that it was inconvenient.

The intensive Japanese language and culture courses combined with the beauty and serenity of Kyoto and cultural field trips made for a wonderful experience. The depth of the program was, for a seemingly short course, impressive. We took multiple field trips to Zen temples, Tokyo Museums, the quiet Kofun in the mountains of Arashiyama, and the Takarazuka Revue.
